



Reopening FAQ's

Is Children's Ministry provided during Sunday services?

Yes! Children's Ministry will be provided for infants to 5th graders.

Is registration required for Children's Ministry?

Registration is required in the effort to prepare for quality programming within stable groups.

Will my child have their temperature checked?

Before entering the church building, a CT volunteer will take your child's temperature. If you or your child has shown symptoms within 72 hours, or have a temperature of 100.4 or higher, we kindly ask that you engage in Church Online and CT Kids Online.

Is my child required to wear a mask?

It is highly recommended that children ages 2 and up wear a mask for the duration of their time in CT Kids.

Will my child need to sanitize their hands upon entering the classroom?

Upon your child's entry into their classroom, they will receive hand sanitizer to clean their hands. You may also take them to the bathroom to wash their hands if that is preferable.

How often will the children's spaces be sanitized?

All CT Kids spaces will be sanitized before and after services.

Can my child bring a snack or toy to service?

In efforts to prevent the spread of germs, we ask that parents do not send a snack or toys with their child. We will provide snacks and sanitized toys. Parents of 0-24 months old children will be able to bring food/milk for their baby.

Will CT Kids volunteers wear a mask?

All CT Kids volunteers will be temperature checked upon arrival and will wear kid-friendly masks.

I am a volunteer at Chicago Tabernacle. Will Children's Ministry be available for my child while I am serving?

Children's Ministry is available to your family while you serve and while you sit in a service.

*Please note: After the 9 am service we will sanitize the building. Please pick up your child immediately after the 9 am service.

I am a volunteer at Chicago Tabernacle. Should I register my child for two services?

Yes, please register your child for the number of services they will participate in while you sit in service and while you serve.
