"Very truly I tell you Pharisees, anyone who does not enter the sheep pen by the gate, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him because they know his voice. But they will never follow a stranger; in fact, they will run away from him because they do not recognize a stranger's voice." # The Shepherd's Voice Is Personal

# The Shepherd's Voice Is Personal

"I **rejoice** in following your statutes as one rejoices in great riches. <sup>15</sup> I **meditate** on your precepts and consider your ways. <sup>16</sup> I **delight** in your decrees; I will not neglect your word.

"Humans excel at selectively listening to a target speaker when there are a lot of background noises, such as many competing voices." - Dr. Tobias Reichenbach, Neuroscientist

Selective listening – **recognizing** and **separating** God's voice from competing voices:

- 1. What Bible verse do I have that is guiding me in this decision?
- 2. Who am I listening to in my life regarding this decision?
