

It was later said of him, "King Henry learned to govern by learning to obey."


The Spirit Makes Us Deeply Aware Commendation

Hachiko Dog, 1923-1935



Hachiko, a golden brown Akita, was the dog of a professor in Shibuya, Tokyo. The professor would commute daily to work, and Hachikō would leave the house to greet him at the end of each day at the nearby train Station. The pair continued the daily routine until May 21, 1925, when the professor did not return; he had suffered a hemorrhage and died without ever returning to the train station in which Hachikō waited.

Each day, for the next nine years, nine months and fifteen days, Hachikō awaited Ueno's return, appearing precisely when the train was due at the station.
