Without Self-Control, We Become:

- 1. Vulnerable: Like a city whose walls are broken through is a person who lacks self-control. *Proverbs 25:28*
- 2. Gullible: A person's own folly leads to their ruin, yet their heart rages against the LORD. Proverbs 19:3 (NIV)
- **3. Temporal:** The prudent see danger and take refuge, but the simple keep going and pay the penalty. *Proverbs 27:12 (NIV)*

John D. Rockefeller's Business Partner




In one of the biggest business blunders in history, John D. Rockefeller's business partner lost out on \$900 million.

In 1878, Rockefeller and Andrews controlled Cleveland's largest oil refinery, and Standard Oil Company's empire was quickly rising.

Andrews, feeling slighted, decided to sell his stake in the company for \$1 million, despite Rockefeller's pleas not to. His stock would have been worth \$900 million by 1930.

"He had too much conceit, too much bull-headed obstinacy and so little self-control. He was his own worst enemy," said Rockefeller.
