Strike the Point Person, Scatter the Rest

If the Enemy Can Deal A Blow to the Point Person He Impacts the Rest by Leaving:

- 1. No Unity
- 2. No Covering
- 3. No Blessing

Strike: Pataxo

- To strike a heavy blow and inflict significant damage, sometimes fatally.
- Same root word as "suffering"

Scatter: Diaskorpizo

- To cause a dreadful disorder, to disperse, disband, and cause division and confusion.

The only way to deal with the enemy's blows is to stay Privately Healthy:

- 1. Anchored in God
- 2. Guided by God
- 3. Living for God
- 4. Growing in God

Be Aware

Fall Away: Skandalizo

- To entrap, to trip up by some trick
- The root word meant "the bait in the trap"; the stick onto which the animal was lured and which snapped the trap when the animal was on it

You've Been Struck a Blow from the Enemy If:

- 1. Your Spiritual Values Have Shifted from the Rock
- 2. You've Cancelled Brothers and Sisters in Christ
- 3. You're Isolated from the Body
