


BELLEVE

³ Among Saul's men was Ahijah the priest, who was wearing the ephod, the priestly vest. Ahijah was the son of Ichabod's brother Ahitub, son of Phinehas, son of Eli, the priest of the Lord who had served at Shiloh. No one realized that Jonathan had left the Israelite camp.

⁴To reach the Philistine outpost, Jonathan had to go down between two rocky cliffs that were called Bozez and Senah. ⁵The cliff on the north was in front of Micmash, and the one on the south was in front of Geba.

¹²Then the men from the outpost shouted to Jonathan, 'Come on up here, and we'll teach you a lesson!" "Come on, climb up right behind me," Jonathan said to his armor bearer, "for the Lord will help us defeat them!" 1 Samuel 14:1-16; 20-23 (NLT)


So the climbed up using both hands and feet, and the Philistines fell before Jonathan, and his armor bearer killed those who came behind them. ¹⁴They killed some twenty men in all, and their bodies were scattered over about half an acre. 1 Samuel 14:1-16; 20-23 (NLT)


- Saul's lookouts in Gibeah of Benjamin saw a strange sight - the vast army of the Philistines began to melt away in every direction...

²¹Even the Hebrews who had previously gone over the Philistine army revolted and joined in with Saul, Jonathan, and the rest of the Israelites. ²²Likewise, the men of Israel who were hiding in the hill country of Ephraim joined the chase when they saw the Philistines running away. 1 Samuel 14:1-16; 20-23 (NLT)

²²So the Lord saved Israel that day, and the battle continued to rage even beyond Bethaven.




BELIEVING LAUNCHES
