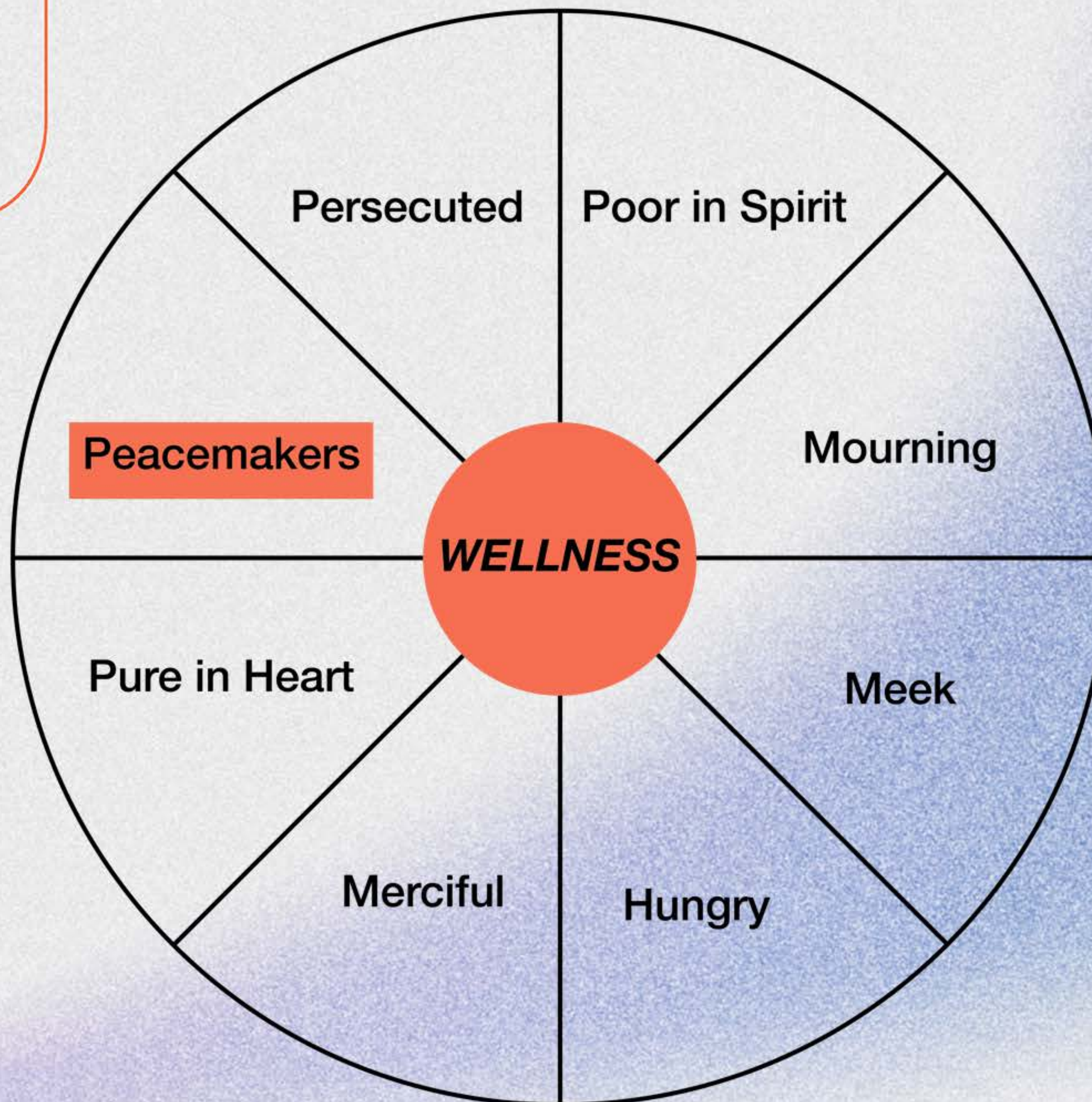

Peacemaker: one who labors for reconciliation, the restoration of relationships, or the resolution of conflicts.

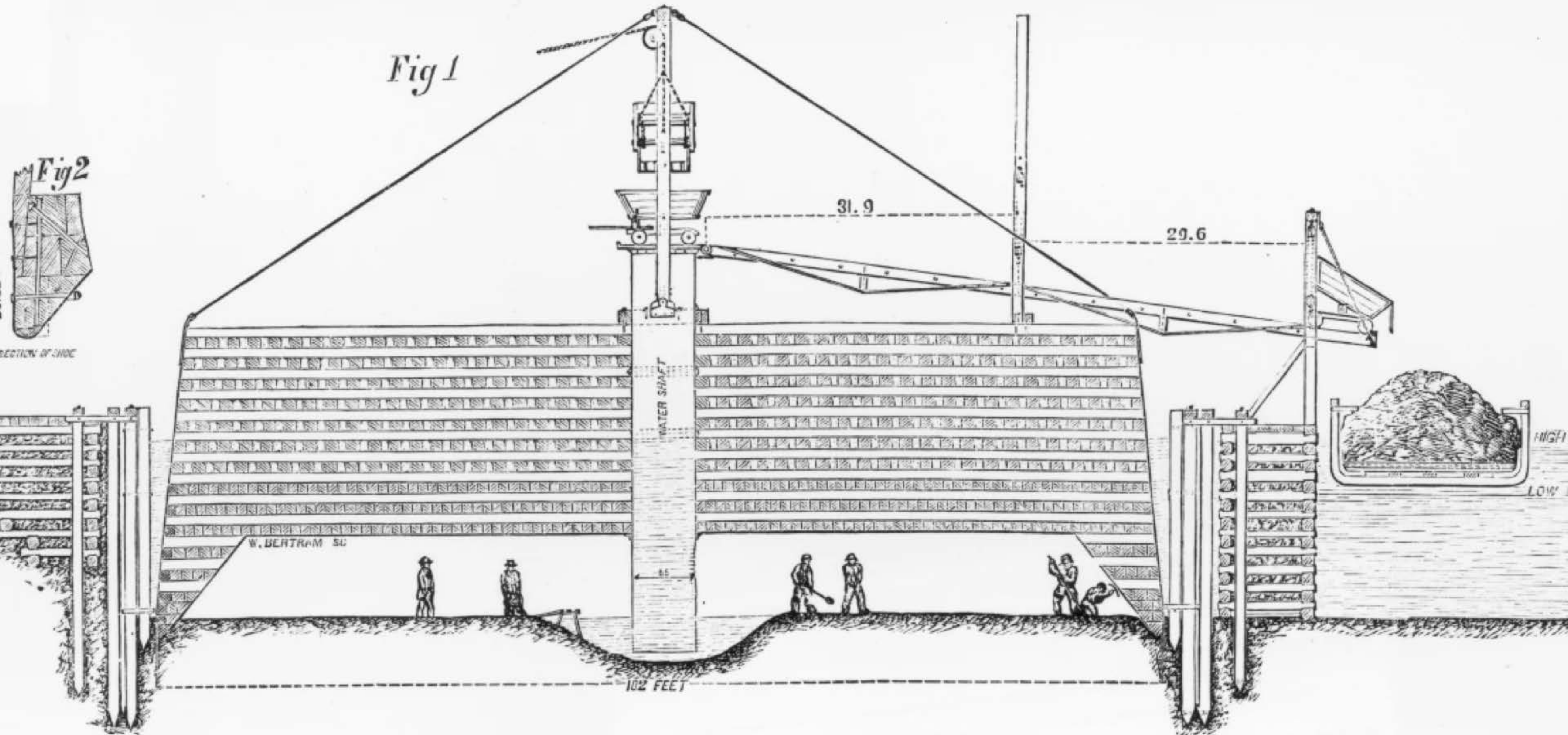
Peacemaking is the higher wisdom, the loftier lifestyle, and part of the most excellent way.

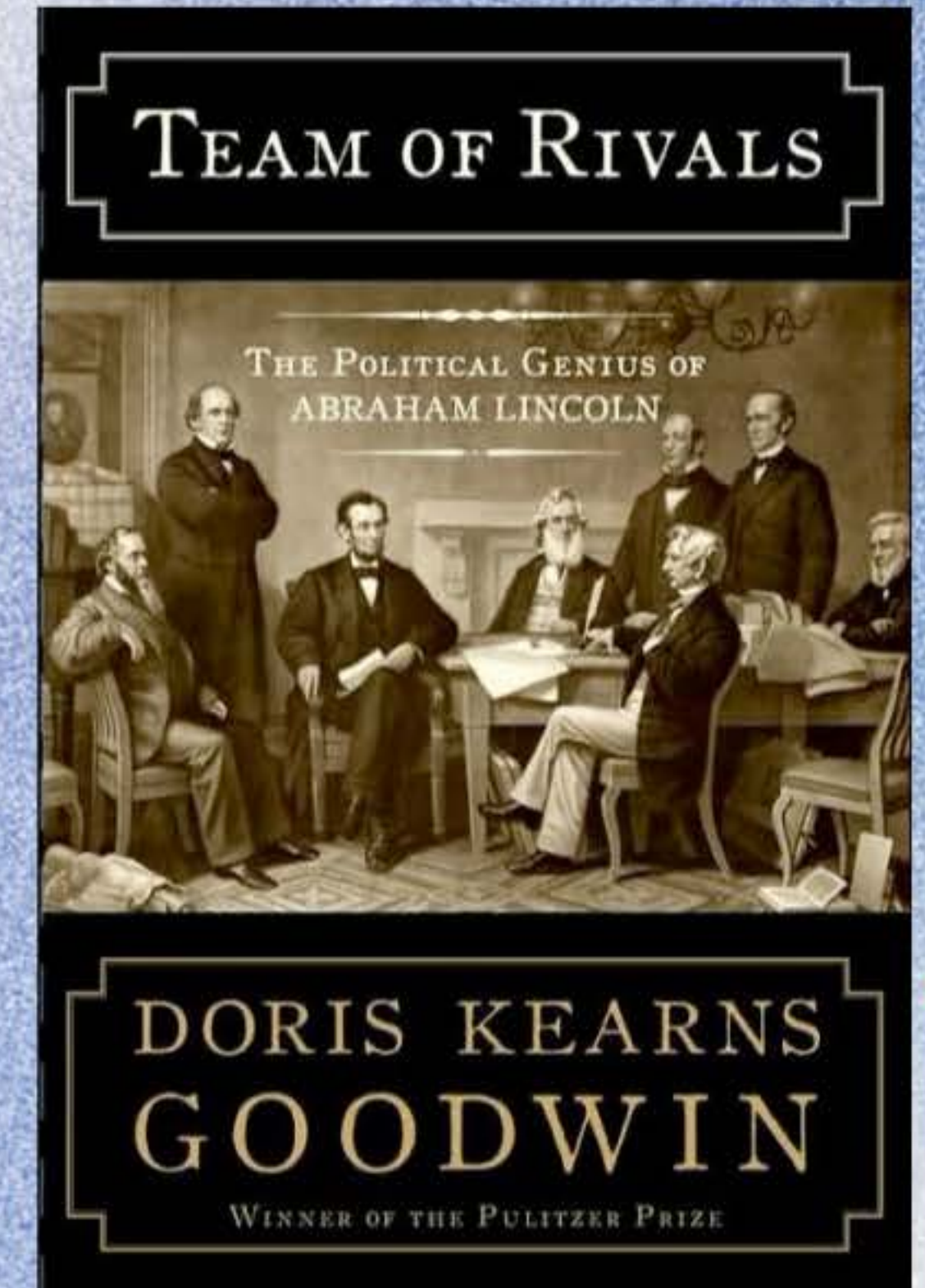

 A red flag means exactly what you think it means: impending danger, a no-go, a big problem, a warning sign.

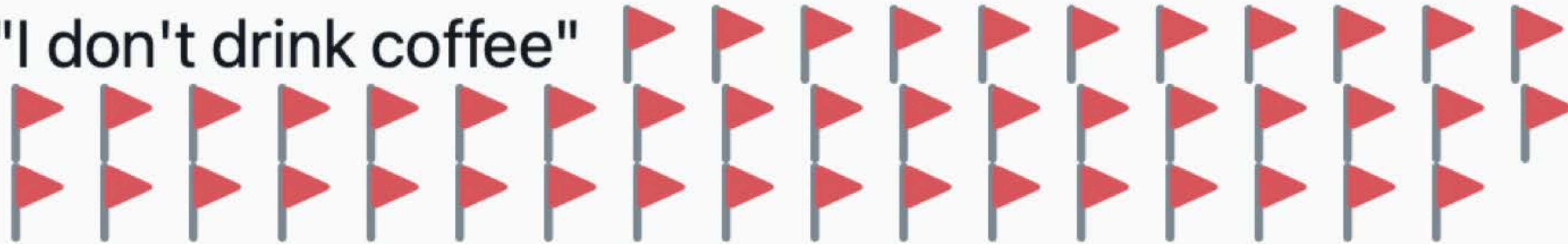

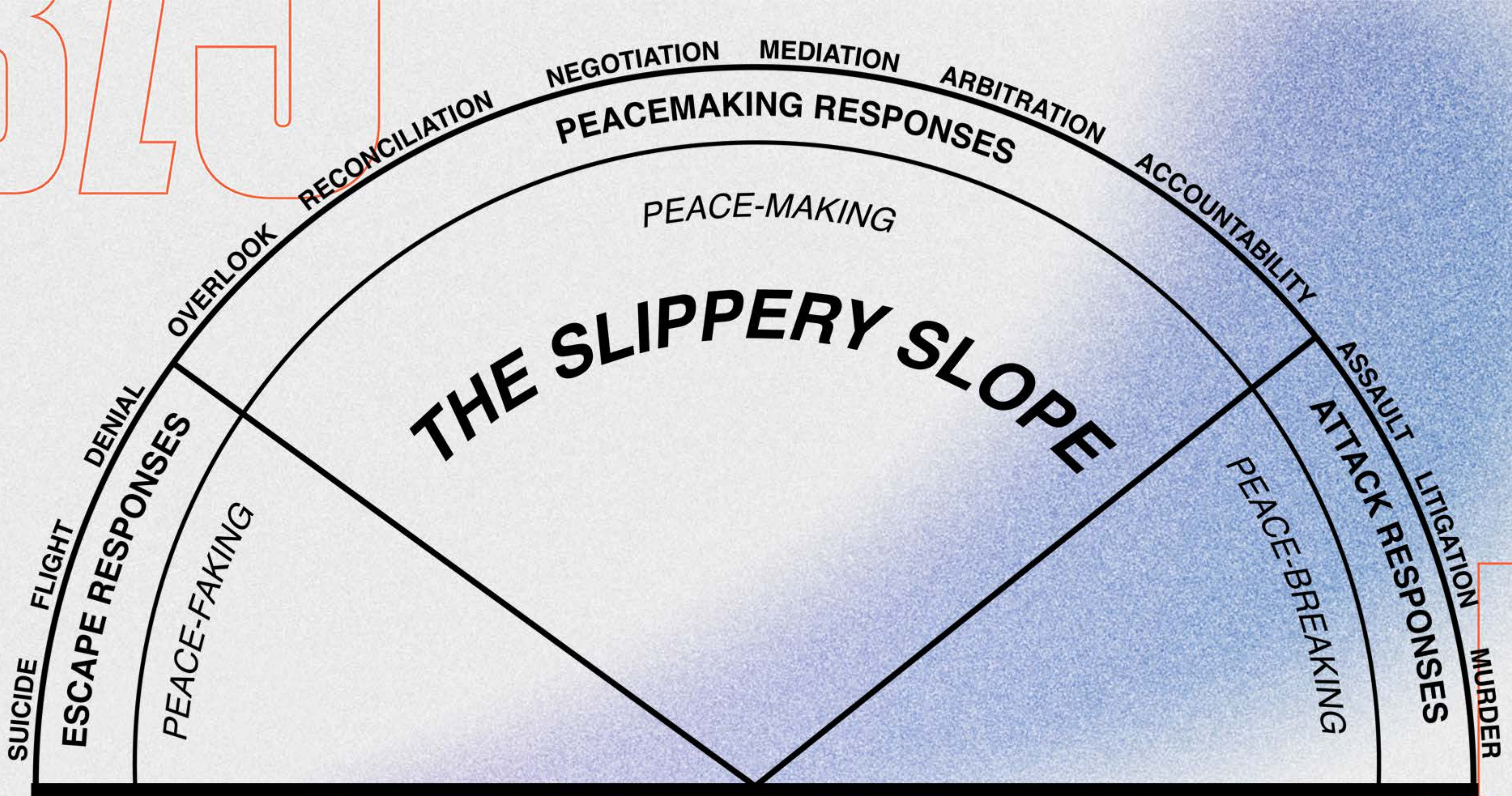
