Condemnation:

the act of declaring something awful or evil - sometimes over ourselves.



The Gospel Provides Salvation in Two Ways:

- 1. Judicially: Jesus paid the debt and lived out the sentence for our sin.
- 2. Practically: Jesus provides His power and nearness so that we can walk in victory.

"The Law and The Gospel differ by the promises each holds out. Both promise eternal life. But the Law's promise has an impossible catch: 'I'll give you life IF you keep me perfectly and without sin.' The Gospel promises eternal life without condition: 'For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works' (Eph. 2:8-9)."

Break Agreement With Condemnation


When you agree with condemnation, you're disagreeing with God.

When you disagree with God, you're breaking fellowship.


David's Self Talk
