Ira Sankey was traveling on a steamer down the Delaware river when he was asked to sing. He led the group in singing "Savior Like a Shepherd Lead Us." When he finished, a man stepped from the shadows and asked, "Did you ever serve in the Union Army?" "Yes," Sankey replied, "in the spring of 1860."
