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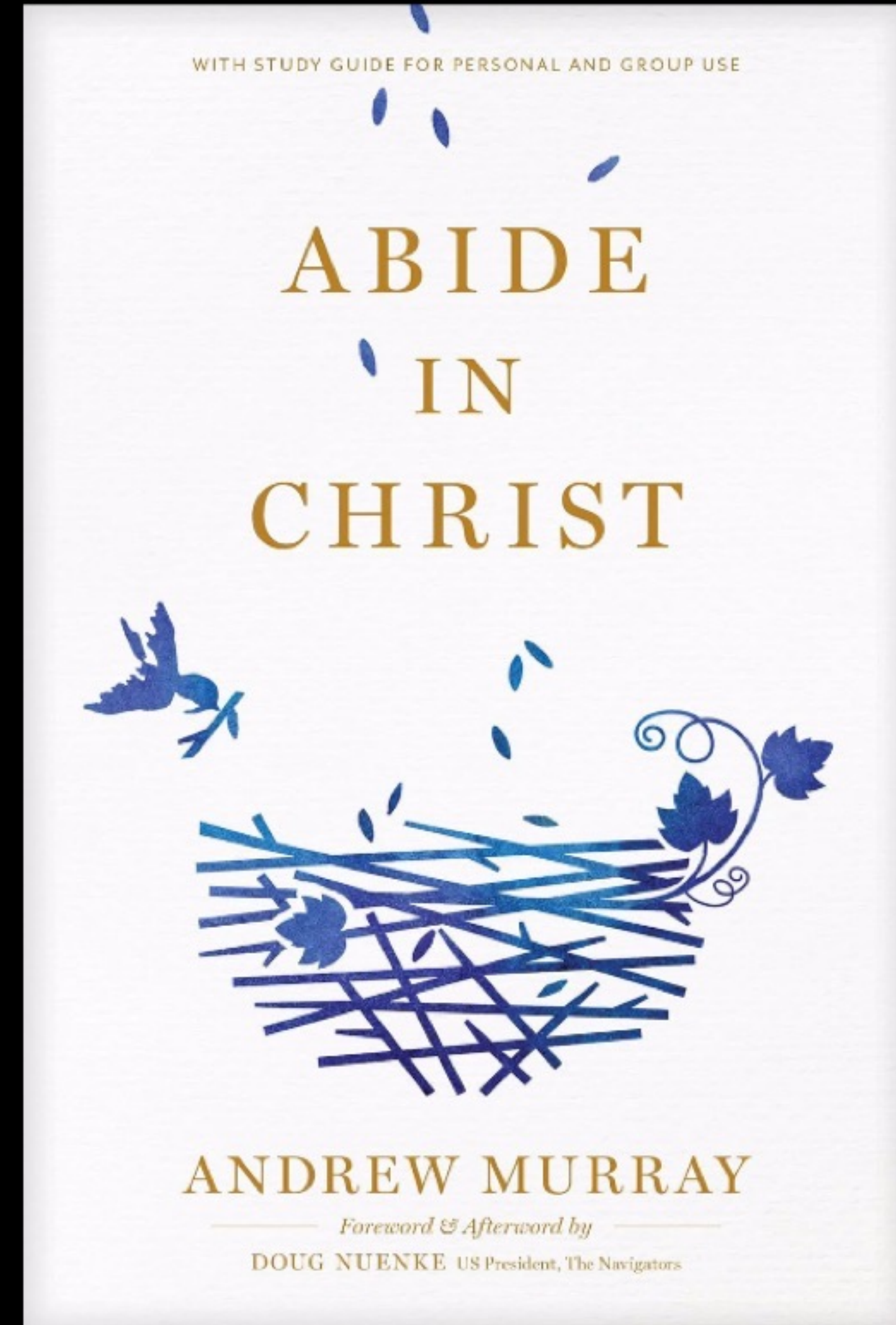

Way #1: Reality

“The soul satisfies itself with thoughts which are but the forms and images of truth, without receiving the truth itself in its power.”

Martin Luther's Rhema Moment



On October 31, 1517, Luther wrote a letter to his bishop in protest of the sale of indulgences. He contended that salvation came through grace alone. Since forgiveness was God's alone to grant, those who claimed that indulgences absolved buyers from all punishments and granted them salvation were in error.

This letter became known as the *Ninety-Five Theses* and sparked the Reformation.
